

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

SNAP, formerly known as the Food Stamp Program, will receive \$20 billion over the next five years -- an important stimulus to the economy. Starting in April, most four-person households will receive an \$80 increase in their monthly SNAP allotment to spend on groceries.
